The Stiftung Humboldt Forum and the Goethe-Institut Sign a "Memorandum of Understanding"

The Goethe-Institut and the Stiftung Humboldt Forum are expanding upon their previous collaborative efforts. To this effect, Johannes Ebert, secretary general of the Goethe-Institut, and Hartmut Dorgerloh, director of the Humboldt Forum, signed a cooperation agreement on 3 March.

The "Memorandum of Understanding" provides the formal framework for the specific organization of cooperation between the Goethe-Institut and the Stiftung Humboldt Forum. In particular, the purpose of this arrangement is to make it easier to apply the expert knowledge of both institutions throughout the world.

Specifically, the cooperation agreement includes regular working meetings in which the concrete collaboration in Germany and abroad can be prepared, supervised and evaluated. A full time position will be established at the Humboldt Forum that will serve as a liaison to the Goethe-Institut. This position will facilitate the development of shared projects and cooperative work and play an active role in political life and civil society in Germany as well as in partner countries. Furthermore, a four-person steering committee with members from both institutions will be established that will meet regularly to discuss the current state of cooperation and possible opportunities for further development.

Additionally, the agreement highlights plans to gather the knowledge and experience of experts and institutions from the Goethe-Institut's worldwide network and integrate them into the Stiftung Humboldt Forum's multifaceted approach. Reciprocal study visits and the temporary exchange of employees are also planned, as is cooperation in the areas of exhibits, events, education and communication as well as scientific and research collaboration.





Exchanges of information and views on specific topics, in particular on the themes of postcolonialism and sustainability, as well as current changes taking place in various parts of the world, will also be reinforced.

About the Humboldt Forum

A new centre of culture and science is being created in Berlin's historical district of Mitte. The Humboldt Forum will bring together the arts, cultures, sciences, people, communities and perspectives and offer a venue for surprising experiments and inspiring encounters. The Stiftung Humboldt Forum im Berliner Schloss (SHF), a foundation with legal capacity under civil law with headquarters in Berlin, is the construction client and future operator of the Humboldt Forum.
